It is an enduring tradition to take time to pause, turn around to look at the fruitful year gone by, achieving both the expected and unexpected, while setting various milestones and then synergizing ourselves to move ahead to face the challenges in the coming year, with a positive attitude. We thank the Almighty for all the blessings bestowed upon us year after year . This year is very remarkable for Vedavyasa Vidyalayam since we celebrate the silver jubilee of CBSE Affiliation. On this joyous moment, I thank our beloved parents and well wishers for your boundless trust and support and encouragement; the dedication and untiring efforts that have taken Vedavyasa Vidyalayam Senior Secondary School and Sainik School to the towering heights of success and accomplishments.

With great pleasure, I present to you a brief Annual report of our school for the academic year 2023- 24. While the focus was on the holistic development of every student, real education took the center stage as in every year.

1. ACADEMICS

During the academic year 2022-23 we had a very outstanding result both in senior school certificate exam and secondary school examination. As every year the pass percentage was 100 in both streams. For class 12th, we had 102 students who brought 80 distinctions, 22 first classes. 26 students attained 90 above marks. With 98.4% Kum Mrianlini M Manoj of plus two commerce stream bagged the school topper position. Kum

Parvathy Hareesh of plus two Science stream bagged the Science topper rank with 97%. In class 10 out of the 158 students who appeared for the exam, 33 students got 90 above marks. We had 97 distinctions, and 42 first classes. With 99.4% - 596/600 Master Akshay Biju bagged the school topper of class 10. He is one of the two national toppers of Maths in Malabar region with 100 out of 100. This year we had 18 national toppers with 100 out of 100 in various subjects.

To strengthen the academics we have regular Department meetings and Subject Resource Group meetings twice a month. Students who need additional support in specific subjects are identified from class 1 to 9 and support classes are arranged every Saturday based on well formulated subject modules prepared by each department. This year we launched VVV90'S Club as a motivation to students who appear for board exam to achieve 90 above marks in all subjects. The members of vvv 90's club were honoured and awarded badges after two exams. This year Bharatheeya Vidyaniketan Kerala initiated state level Talent Search Exam Quiz 4 Whiz for students from class 1 to 9. Out of 1671 students 1527 appeared and 1027 students qualified for the District level test. This year special efforts were taken to strengthen Foundation stage and class 3 and four of Preparatory stage as per the guidelines of NEP. The number of students qualified Samskrithi Njan Exam from class 4 to 10 is 253.

2. SISUVATIKA

In Sisuvatika, our mission is to provide a nurturing and stimulating environment that fosters the holistic development of young minds, empowering children to become confident, curious, and compassionate lifelong learners. This year, Sisuvatika successfully implemented numerous nurture-based outdoor learning programs that complemented classroom learning, enhancing the overall educational experience for our children. One such remarkable program that provided our kids with a real-world experience was the Doctors' Day celebrations. This initiative allowed us to express gratitude to our doctors, who are community helpers, and enabled our students to better understand the concept of healthcare.

Our commitment to preserving traditions and culture is evident in the various activities we organize, such as Yoga Day, Karkkidakam Day, Ramayana Month, and more. Additionally,

our Kargil Vijay Divas activities and field trips related to community helpers empower our children to develop a strong commitment to our community, fostering a robust connection with the world around them.

At Sisuvatika, every activity is treated as a celebration, and every learning experience is designed to be joyful, akin to the way our children learn about colours. We believe in making the learning journey a source of excitement and engagement.

Keeping in align with the recommendations of NEP 2020, we restructured the class pattern as 5+3+3+4. The foundation stage of 5 years begins with the age group 3 to 4 in pre kg which is named as Class Arun. Age group 4 to 5 will be Uday and 5 to 6 is Prabhath. Admission for the academic year 2024-25 started on Vijayadasami day and completed 2 rounds.

3. STAFF EMPOWERMENT

During the vacation from May 15th to May 30th, we arranged subject wise and generic orientation programmes for teachers. Professional trainers and other subject experts handled various sessions. These sessions definitely helped to enhance productivity and creativity among teachers. Apart from this every month we conduct Acharya Vikas Dinam for professional and personal development. Our teachers are also attending online and offline capacity building programmes organized by CBSE.

4. STUDENT EMPOWERMENT

4.1. As per scheduled in the annual pedagogical plan this year we had various activities facilitating the overall development of children. We conducted various residential camps for students in the month of March and April. For Uday section(UKG) it was "Thennal" , for Sainik students three days' camp with the title, "Brigade 23". For classes 5th and 8th we conducted the camp as "UNARV 23" Finally for classes 10th and 12th "VESAK 23"Eminent Personalities like:

The focus of the camp was to promote creativity, self expression and exploration and instill the feeling of social responsibility. The Camp Attractions were Prathasmarana, Yoga ,Games, Skit preparation and presentation, Career Guidance, Group Discussion, Motivational sessions, Nadan Paattu, Theatre, Sing with Violin, Bhajan, Magic Show, Painting, Trekking, Swimming and many more. More than 600 students and 70 teachers attended the camps.

4.2. CCA

This year we launched CCA where children from class 4 to 9 are getting opportunity to specialize in one art form and one sport event . Every week they get 2 hours time for this specialized coaching. Every week 1040 students undergo this training in 5 art forms and 5 sport items

5. CLUB ACTIVITIES

Club activities help students to explore themselves ,cultivate a sense of unity and working with others in reaching the same goals. We provided a number of platforms for children to experiment and bring out their potential.

5.1 SAMMILAN

A fusion of 17 clubs inaugurated by Television director and actor Sri Midhun Chettoor, Director Marimayam on 16th June.

5.2 English Club-

In connection with Reading Day various competitions were conducted . A week long programmes were conducted in November. Main attractions were Show and tell, Jumbled words, Word ladder, deserted island, recitation, book review, role play, spin and talk, public speaking.

5.3 Malayalam Club-

Various competitions conducted for a week in connection with Reading Day, June 19. Chingam 1 was celebrated as Farmer's Day. Celebrated Kerala piravi. For classes 1 and 2 this year we started sahithya samajam and for higher classes literary quiz.

5.4 Sanskrit Club-

In connection with International Yoga day poster making and sanskrit speech were conducted. On July 3rd as part of Gurupoornima, Sanskrit documentary on the life of Vyasa prepared by students was released at ATL Lab. Valmiki ramayanam was chanted during Ramayana month celebrations. Various other competitions like puppet making, Valmiki Ramayana Quiz were conducted. Sanskrit week celebration from September 11 onwards. On Nov 23 Kalidasa Jyanthy was observed. Our students participated in Revathy Pattahanam Sanskrit competitions

5.5 Hindi Club-

5.6 Maths Club -

5.7 Science Club-

Environment Day, International Asteroid Day, Chandrayan 3 launching, Moon day and Ozone day were celebrated with various programmes and competitions. On July 21 a space camp was conducted for children by UL Space Club. Monthly workshops are arranged on space research programme. Niranj and Krishna from class 7 launched their rockets at NIT as part of Science Expo Prototype presentation. For NFC based locker system Adidev Narayan got second prize at NIT.

Science, Maths and Social Exhibition, Vision Explora was on 8th September.

5.8 Social Science-

It is proud to say that our team reached semi final of this prestigious event. Our students qualified to South Zone in the NDA Wizquiz 2023 and G20 Thinq. Our students won prize in Inter school quiz conducted by Forest department. Our school won prizes in the district level quiz of Malyala Manorama Read and win quiz. Luminous Sparks 6.0, the uniqueness of vvv, All Kerala Inter School Quiz on Indian Culture and Heritage in fond memory of APJ's visit to our school was conducted as intra school quiz due to the outbreak of Nipa.

5.12 Anti Narcotic Club

In connection with World Anti Tobacco day our students conducted a rally in association with Excise department . 5.17 Sports Club

BVN District Kabaddi, Kho Kho, Chess, Badminton and football. In 14 group events our school teams won 9 First positions and 5 second positions. Bvn State kabaddi, kho kho , Chess and badminton our teams won 7 group events and qualified for south zone.

Vidyabharathi south zone football bala boys of our school won first place and participated in the national football . In south zone badminton our teams bagged second place in bala and kishore. In BVN District athletics we have won the overall championship and 14

students qualified for state athletics. In state athletics we had 4 first, 6 second and 4 third places. In Sahodaya Inter school chess our teams won third position

School Annual Athletics was held on November 28 for Juniors and December 8 for seniors at Medical college stadium ground. The meet was inaugurated by our own alumni Sri Naveen Krishna, Petty Officer Indian Navy Volley ball player and Sri Akhina I, Signal operator, Defence Ministry.
